Workshop 1: Social Marketing Strategies: The Potential for Reducing Pollution

This session will introduce participants to social change and the ability of strategic communicators and marketers to promote social change. Social marketing is an approach that may be applied in the fields of public health, environmental management, community development, crime prevention, addiction recovery, social work, religious work, education and training, the arts, public transportation, conservation, and agriculture, among others. While this session will introduce participants to the approach in general, the goal will include discussing the potential of this strategy for reducing pollution in the Republic of North Macedonia.

Workshop 2: European Green Deal and Carbon Tax Policy

As climate change is becoming a pressing issues that needs to be urgently addressed, the European Green Deal has been presented as a roadmap for making the EU's economy sustainable. This will happen by turning climate and environmental challenges into opportunities across all policy areas and making the transition just and inclusive for all. Within it, the EU will create a Just Transition Fund in order to provide financial support and technical assistance to help people, businesses and regions that are most affected by the move towards the green economy.

The Western Balkan countries are firmly oriented towards becoming EU member states and are strengthening more than ever their economic and political relations with the Union. Hence, questions on the potential effects that the European Green Deal and the Carbon Tax Policy aspect will have on their future integration process are becoming very essential in the ongoing climate and energy debate. Considering the existing energy infrastructure where coal is still the predominant resource, as well as the concerns for an urgent need for ambitious climate policy action by all countries, these and many other related questions will be in the focus of this workshop.
